



**Left:** Views of the exterior and the building lobby. The building, designed in 1919 by the firm of Starrett-vanVleet, is clad with white terra cotta. The existing marble walls and plaster ceilings of the main lobby were refurbished and the lighting up-dated.

**Right:** The top two views are of a one-bedroom apartment in the "F" line; the bottom two of a studio apartment in the "K" line, fitted in this case with a loft. The loft is, in a sense, furniture, in that it is not affixed to the walls and can be dismantled and moved. Theoretically, most of the studio and one-bedroom apartments could be fitted with a loft.
